#### Dear Church Family,

Let us (Pastor Mike & Sally) tell you a true story ...

Once upon a time, about a generation ago, God planted a church called Hope. There were only a dozen or so of us back then, but we had dreams and we had hope. A few months later, after some challenging and humbling experiences, we fully surrendered this church to God, and immediately Hope started to grow. A dozen people quickly multiplied into hundreds ...

#### "And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved." Acts 2:47

Soon after, we drove by a cornfield (24 acres) at the corner of Ashworth Road & Jordan Creek Parkway. There was just something about this field (of dreams), and we felt compelled by the Holy Spirit to stop, and park, and walk, and pray, and imagine a new church





building for Hope on that field. We knew our first church building on just four-plus acres of land down the road wasn't going to be big enough for our growing congregation.

So, we called the commercial real estate agent whose phone number was on the big wooden "For Sale" sign at the corner of Ashworth & Jordan Creek. He was patient and kind ... and honest enough to tell us that we couldn't afford to buy that field (a generation later, that same real estate agent now worships at Hope every Sunday, on the same land he rightfully told us we couldn't afford at the time, and he often sits right next to us in the front row!).

When we let God write our story, it always turns out better ...

A few years later, still feeling the Spirit's nudge to plant Hope on that particular field of dreams, we invited the owner of that field to Hope. A charmingly grumpy older man showed up on a Sunday and God captured his heart. After the service, with tears in his eyes, he drastically reduced the price of his field, just for our church, so that it might become holy ground for Hope!

To turn that dream into reality, Hope embarked on two successive giving campaigns, one to buy the field on Ashworth & Jordan Creek (Moving to a Promised Land) and one to build the



first phase of a new house of worship (Building Hope for a New Millennium).

Fast forward through 30 years and three more giving campaigns to today's chapter of our Hope story ... now, in 2024, God has developed Hope into a thriving multisite mission church numbering more than 20,000 members, and outreach to millions of people worldwide, and the only possible explanation for such miraculous growth is God ...

#### "I planted the seed in your hearts, and Apollos watered it, but it was God who made it grow." 1 Corinthians 3:6

Our hearts are filled with gratitude for the front-row seats we've had to see God transform thousands of lives, convert countless souls, and miraculously build Hope over the past 30 years from just a dozen or so people to the largest and fastestgrowing Lutheran church in America ...

#### "Blessed are the eyes that see what (we) have seen." Luke 10:23

... Yet we are even more enthusiastic (much more so, in fact!) for the future God has planned for Lutheran Church of Hope ... the best is yet to come!

To realize God's exciting plans for Hope's future, it's time for us as a church to embark together on a 23day (Nov. 2-24), outreach-focused, God-blessed, Christ-centered, Spiritled, Bible-based and prayer-driven giving campaign -- guilt-free and pressure-free (the manner in which we give is more important than the amount) – called **Building Hope for Tomorrow ...**  "Don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. 'For God loves a person who gives cheerfully.'" 2 Corinthians 9:6-7

We are **Building Hope for** Tomorrow to create beautiful, Godhonoring and highly functional holy spaces (see new building plans at buildinghopefortomorrow.org) that will open new doors for Lutheran Church of Hope to even more effectively love our neighbors (Mark 12:31), serve our community (1 Peter 4:10), connect our isolated and divided world (Galatians 3:28), compete for the hearts of new generations (Psalm 145:4), and carry out Christ's mission for generations to come (Matthew 28:19-20) as a faithful, vibrant and

#### Through Building Hope for

Tomorrow, we're going all in on outreach! Building plans call for a new two-story Youth & Mission Outreach Center, Food Pantry and Community Garden. There's a proposal to buy an Outreach Bus to bring hope to our neighbors in need. We also hope to create a Prayer Cove, workstations, safe and fun hang-out rooms for teens, play spaces for kids, recreational courts, and walking paths. It's all for our community (not just our congregation), it's all for free, and it's all for the sake of mission and love ...

#### "Keep on loving each other ... show hospitality to strangers." Hebrews 13:1-2

It might be easier to ignore the needs of our community and just build what we want for ourselves as a congregation, avoid giving campaigns that push us outside our spiritual comfort zones and turn



church life into nothing more than holy huddles for members only. But that's not faithful, that's not biblical, and that's not our story ...

#### "So let's not get tired of doing what is good. At just the right time we will reap a harvest of blessing if we don't give up." Galatians 6:9

This is our story! Once upon a time, God planted a mission church called Hope in a cornfield in Iowa to reach out to the world around us and share the everlasting love of Jesus Christ (Hope's mission statement). The first generation of Hope's story has been a page-turner! And through **Building Hope for Tomorrow,** a new generation of inspiring and miraculous stories that God writes for us, and through us, are about to begin ...

How absolutely awesome is that?!

Let's go, Hope! Let's rise up together to humbly and faithfully ask God to start **Building Hope for Tomorrow** through us! When we let God write our stories, they always turn out better ... for now and forever!

# What We Believe at Hope

#### **Our Mission**

Reach out to the world around us and share the everlasting love of Jesus Christ.

#### **Our Vision**

Powered by the Spirit to bring Christ to all cultures, revive the world with God's love and make heaven more crowded!

#### **Our Core Values**

- 1. Jesus is life. The rest is details. Jesus Christ alone is our hope, and the only real and lasting hope for the world (John 14:6). We love him. For this reason, we don't apologize for the gospel or for putting our relationship with him first in our lives (Romans 1:16). We strive to respond faithfully to the call of Jesus to follow him above all else in this world, which so often competes for our time, energy and attention (Luke 14:15-24).
- 2. Lost people matter to God and so they matter to us. Jesus was sent to reconcile a lost world to God (Luke 15:1-32), and he calls us to do the same. We like unchurched people, and we know what a difference Jesus can make in their lives. For this reason, we seek to reach out to the world around us and share the everlasting love of Jesus Christ (Matthew 28:19-20, John 20:21, 1 Corinthians 9:19-27, Lutheran Church of Hope mission statement).
- 3. We worship God, not tradition. Where tradition helps to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ and further the mission of our church, we embrace it. Where tradition becomes a wall between God and his people, we seek to tear it down (John 2:13-22, Matthew 23:13-36, John 9:1-41). While the gospel message of Jesus Christ remains unchanged (Hebrews 13:8), the manner in which it is proclaimed must change for it to be communicated effectively in a changing world (Mark 2:21-22). In our worship and in our ministry, we intentionally offer a wide variety of options from traditional to contemporary and we remain open to new waves of innovation sent to the church by the Holy Spirit of God all for the sake of Christian mission (Psalm 146-150, Acts 2:1-42).





- 4. Following Jesus is a growing experience. We can't outgrow Christian faith. As modern-day disciples of Jesus Christ, we are called to move from spiritual infancy to spiritual maturity (Philippians 3:13-14, Ephesians 4:12-14). For this reason, we strive to bring people into an ever-growing relationship with Jesus Christ (Matthew 28:19). This growth best happens in small groups (Acts 2:42-47). As we grow in faith, we turn our hearts to God, giving of ourselves and our resources – freely and cheerfully (2 Corinthians 9:7).
- 5. We are one body, united in Jesus Christ. We are a church of individuals, different in many ways, yet called together by God to be one in ministry and mission. As members of the same body, we become more effective when we work in harmony as a unified whole (John 17:20-23). Among us, love for one another is the norm (John 13:34, Romans 13:8), conflicts are resolved according to the teaching of Jesus (Matthew 18:15-17), and we seek to build each other up (1 Thessalonians 5:11). We rejoice together, and we suffer together (1 Corinthians 12:25-27).

"In 2012 we paid off Hope's building loan and burned our mortgage, vowing as a part of that campaign that any future church building renovations or additions connected to Hope in West Des Moines would happen without a new mortgage. That is still the case! We'll build when we have the money to pay for it. No interest. No debt. No loans. We'll wait to build Phase 1 until we meet that goal. The Building Fund will remain active and open. As soon as it tops \$3 million, we'll start building ... whether that's by the end of 2024, three years from now, or 10 years from now. Same deal with the other specific giving and building phases for Building Hope for Tomorrow. When we reach \$15 million, for instance, we'll start with Phase 3 of construction and 'Finish the Race'!" – Pastor Mike
